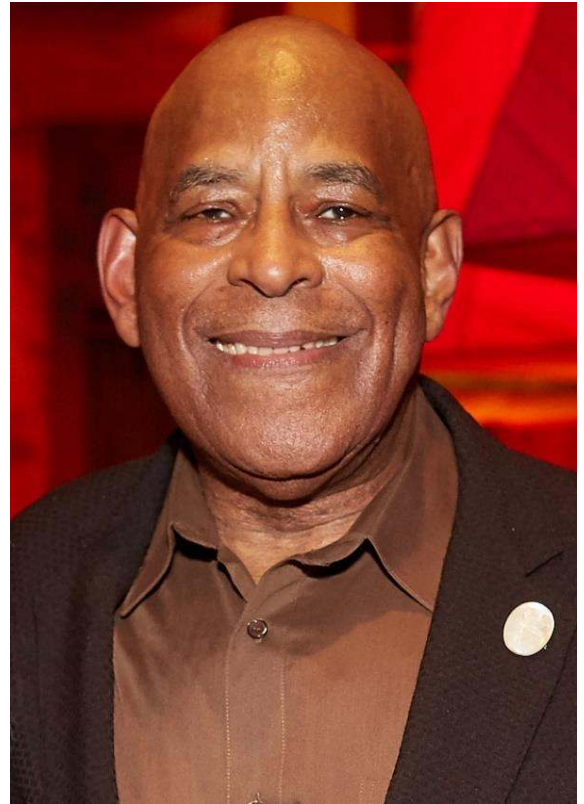


Reginald L. Ollie Biography

The BOMA/Chicago Foundation's Reginald L. Ollie Scholarship is named after Reggie Ollie, a dedicated commercial real estate professional who served as the Chair of BOMA/Chicago's Diversity Committee for over ten years.

Established in 2005, the Ollie Scholarship recognizes and develops minority leaders in the CRE industry, providing full tuition to achieve the Real Property Administrator (RPA) designation.

Ollie's real estate experience spans over three decades. For 17 years, he worked at The Montauk Company, managing the leasing and operations of the historic Monadnock Building. He then served as the President of Monroe Vintage Management, where he oversaw a portfolio of historic office buildings.
