PROTECTING YOUR MAIL

Postal Inspectors are federal agents charged with enforcing over 200 federal statutes that protect the Postal Service and the U.S. Mail from illegal or dangerous use.

Here's what you can do to protect your mail from thieves:

- Use the letter slots inside your post office for your mail or hand it to a letter carrier.
- Pick up your mail promptly after delivery. Don't leave it in your mailbox overnight.
- If you don't receive a check or other valuable mail you're expecting, contact the issuing party immediately.
- Don't send cash in the mail.
- Sign up for Hold Mail service on USPS.com if you plan on being away from home or won't be able to check your mail for a few days.

- Report all suspected mail theft to the Postal Inspection Service at www.uspis.gov/report.
- Become involved/engaged in your neighborhood via neighborhood watches and local social media groups to spread awareness and share information.
- Sign-up for Informed Delivery at **USPS.com**. This service provides daily email notifications of incoming mail and packages.
